MINUTE OF DEATH OF

ROBERT LYON ROGERS, U. S. COMMISSIONER.

John C. Rose, Esq., announced to the Court the death of

Robert Lyon Rogers, Esq., United States Commissioner at Baltimore.

Mr. Rose paid a high tribute to the character of Mr. Rogers

and to the ability and dignity with which he ^{had} filled the office of

United States Commissioner for ~~so~~ many years. He moved that the

Court adjourn in respect to his memory.

Morris A. Soper, Esq., Assistant United States Attorney,

seconded the motion.

Judge Morris in responding, said that it was with a

very sincere feeling of loss that the Court ~~felt~~ the death of

Mr. Rogers.

He referred ~~with deep appreciation to the strong~~

sense of duty and ~~characterized him as a man strong in his~~

which characterized Mr. Rogers in his
official actions during the forty odd years in which he held
the office of United States Commissioner and the just
and impartial manner in which he acted upon his
convictions of right.

He had ~~the peculiar and unusual~~

ability to get at the truth in criminal cases and to judge of the weight of testimony. In dealing with the maritime cases many of which were heard by him he showed great ability in dealing with the complaints of sailors and by treating them firmly but without harshness he so impressed them and ~~the~~ ^{Master of} ~~gift of dealing with sailors firmly but without harshness~~ ~~that~~ ~~ships~~ ~~with his justice and fairness that in many cases a settlement was arrived at upon fair terms, which with justice and fair treatment to all. Many were the cases saved long delays and costs and relieved the court of troublesome litigation.~~

~~that he settled without the necessity of their being brought to~~ ~~His long term of office was replete with good work and his death is a great loss to the~~ ~~Court and his death and removal is a great loss to the community.~~
