**STANDING ORDER 2011-02**

At its March 2011 session, the Judicial Conference of the United States amended the maximum fees for realtime services. The amended fees are based on the number of realtime connections (feeds) provided by a certified realtime court reporter. Under the new maximum fees for realtime services, all parties to the case who receive a realtime feed pay the same amount for the services that are received. If a court reporter provides two or more feeds to the same party to the case, the reporter may charge for each feed provided based on the total number of feeds ordered.

Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED that for any transcripts produced pursuant to orders or authorizations which are received by the court reporters on or after the date of this Order, official court reporters may charge the following rates:

It is further ORDERED that any transcripts produced pursuant to orders or authorizations received by the court reporters prior to the date of this Order shall be billed at the amounts in effect at the time the order was placed.
