**STANDING ORDER 2018-02**

At its March 2018 meeting, the Judicial Conference of the United States approved a new 3-day transcript delivery category, defined as “a transcript to be delivered within three (3) calendar days after receipt of an order.” Accordingly, it is hereby

ORDERED that Standing Order 2011-02 is rescinded; and it is further

ORDERED that for any transcripts produced pursuant to orders or authorizations which are received by the court reporters on or after the date of this Order, official court reporters may charge the following rates:

<sup>1</sup> A draft unedited transcript produced by a certified realtime reporter as a byproduct of realtime to be delivered electronically during proceedings or immediately following receipt of the order. Although prepared by a certified court reporter, an unedited draft is not a certified transcript.

<sup>2</sup> A realtime “feed” is the electronic data flow from the court reporter to the computer of each person or party ordering and receiving the realtime transcription in the courtroom.

It is further ORDERED that any transcripts produced pursuant to orders or authorizations received by the court reporters prior to the date of this Order shall be billed at the amounts in effect at the time the order was placed.
