² A realtime "feed" is the electronic data flow from the court reporter to the computer of each person or party ordering and receiving the realtime transcription in the courtroom.

It is further ORDERED that any transcripts produced pursuant to orders or authorizations received by the court reporters prior to October 1, 2023, shall be billed at the amounts in effect at the time the order was placed.
